3 **TITLE VI—AUTHORIZATION OF**
4 **APPROPRIATIONS**

5 **Subtitle A—Department of State**

6 **SEC. 601. ADMINISTRATION OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—The following amounts are au-
8 thorized to be appropriated under “Administration of For-
9 eign Affairs” for the Department of State to carry out

1 the authorities, functions, duties, and responsibilities in
2 the conduct of foreign affairs of the United States, and
3 for other purposes authorized by law:

4 (b) DIPLOMATIC AND CONSULAR PROGRAMS.—

5 (1) IN GENERAL.—There is authorized to be
6 appropriated for fiscal year 2011, for “Diplomatic
7 and Consular Programs”, \$9,545,221,000, of
8 which—

9 (A) \$1,560,700,000 is authorized to be ap-
10 propriated for worldwide security protection;
11 and

12 (B) \$567,570,000 is authorized to be ap-
13 propriated for public diplomacy.

14 (2) TRANSFERS.—

15 (A) TO EMERGENCIES ACCOUNT.—Of the
16 amounts authorized to be appropriated under
17 paragraph (1), up to \$10,000,000 may be
18 transferred to, and merged with amounts in,
19 the “Emergencies in the Diplomatic and Con-
20 sular Service Account”.

21 (B) FROM EMERGENCIES ACCOUNT.—Of
22 the amounts authorized to be appropriated for
23 fiscal year 2011 for the “Emergencies in the
24 Diplomatic and Consular Service Account,” up
25 to \$1,000,000 may be transferred to, and

1 merged with amounts in, the “Repatriation
2 Loans Program Account”.

3 (c) CAPITAL INVESTMENT FUND.—There is author-
4 ized to be appropriated \$144,100,000 for fiscal year 2011
5 for “Capital Investment Fund”, .

6 (d) EMBASSY SECURITY, CONSTRUCTION, AND MAIN-
7 TENANCE.—There is authorized to be appropriated for fis-
8 cal year 2011—

9 (1) \$857,300,000 for ongoing operations; and

10 (2) \$824,200,000 for worldwide security up-
11 grades.

12 (e) CIVILIAN STABILIZATION INITIATIVE.—There is
13 authorized to be appropriated \$184,000,000 for fiscal year
14 2011, for “Civilian Stabilization Initiative”.

15 (f) EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL EXCHANGE PRO-
16 GRAMS.—There is authorized to be appropriated for fiscal
17 year 2011, for “Educational and Cultural Exchange Pro-
18 grams”, \$633,200,000, of which—

19 (1) \$750,000 may be used to carry out the Ti-
20 betan scholarship program established under section
21 103(b)(1) of the Human Rights, Refugee, and Other
22 Foreign Relations Provisions Act of 1996 (Public
23 Law 104–319); and

24 (2) \$650,000 may be used for the “Ngawang
25 Choepel Exchange Programs” (formerly known as

1 “programs of educational and cultural exchange be-
2 tween the United States and the people of Tibet”)
3 under section 103(a) of such Act.

4 (g) REPRESENTATION ALLOWANCES.—There is au-
5 thorized to be appropriated \$8,175,000 for fiscal year
6 2011 for “Representation Allowances”.

7 (h) PROTECTION OF FOREIGN MISSIONS AND OFFI-
8 CIALS.—There is authorized to be appropriated
9 \$27,200,000 for fiscal year 2011 for “Protection of For-
10 eign Missions and Officials”.

11 (i) EMERGENCIES IN THE DIPLOMATIC AND CON-
12 SULAR SERVICE.—There is authorized to be appropriated
13 \$11,000,000 for fiscal year 2011 for “Emergencies in the
14 Diplomatic and Consular Service”.

15 (j) REPATRIATION LOANS.—There is authorized to
16 be appropriated \$1,450,000 for fiscal year 2011, for “Re-
17 patriation Loans”.

18 (k) PAYMENT TO THE AMERICAN INSTITUTE IN TAI-
19 WAN.—There is authorized to be appropriated
20 \$21,420,000 for fiscal year 2011 for “Payment to the
21 American Institute in Taiwan”.

22 (l) OFFICE OF THE INSPECTOR GENERAL.—There is
23 authorized to be appropriated for fiscal year 2011, for
24 “Office of the Inspector General”, \$120,152,000, of
25 which—

1 (1) \$22,125 ,000 is authorized to be appro-
2 priated for the Special Inspector General for Iraq
3 Reconstruction; and

4 (2) \$35,287,000 is authorized to be appro-
5 priated for the Special Inspector General for Af-
6 ghanistan Reconstruction.

7 **SEC. 602. INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS AND CON-**
8 **FERENCES.**

9 (a) ASSESSED CONTRIBUTIONS TO INTERNATIONAL
10 ORGANIZATIONS.—There is authorized to be appropriated
11 to the Department of State for fiscal year 2011, for “Con-
12 tributions to International Organizations”,
13 \$1,595,430,000 to carry out—

14 (1) the authorities, functions, duties, and re-
15 sponsibilities in the conduct of the foreign affairs of
16 the United States with respect to international orga-
17 nizations; and

18 (2) other authorized activities relating to such
19 purposes.

20 (b) CONTRIBUTIONS FOR INTERNATIONAL PEACE-
21 KEEPING ACTIVITIES.—There is authorized to be appro-
22 priated to the Department of State for fiscal year 2011,
23 for “Contributions for International Peacekeeping Activi-
24 ties”, \$2,182,300,000, which—

25 (1) shall be used to carry out—

1 (A) the authorities, functions, duties, and
2 responsibilities of the United States with re-
3 spect to international peacekeeping activities;
4 and

5 (B) other authorized activities relating to
6 such purposes; and

7 (2) shall remain available until expended.

8 (c) FOREIGN CURRENCY EXCHANGE RATE.—

9 (1) IN GENERAL.—In addition to amounts au-
10 thorized to be appropriated under this section, there
11 are authorized to be appropriated such sums as may
12 be necessary for fiscal year 2011 to offset adverse
13 fluctuations in foreign currency exchange rates.

14 (2) LIMITATION.—Amounts appropriated pur-
15 suant to this subsection shall be available for obliga-
16 tion and expenditure only to the extent that the Di-
17 rector of the Office of Management and Budget de-
18 termines and certifies to Congress that such
19 amounts are necessary due to the fluctuations de-
20 scribed in paragraph (1).

21 **SEC. 603. INTERNATIONAL COMMISSIONS.**

22 (a) IN GENERAL.—The following amounts are au-
23 thorized to be appropriated under “International Commis-
24 sions” for the Department of State to carry out the au-
25 thorities, functions, duties, and responsibilities in the con-

1 duct of the foreign affairs of the United States with re-
2 spect to international commissions and for other purposes
3 authorized by law:

4 (b) INTERNATIONAL BOUNDARY AND WATER COM-
5 MISSION, UNITED STATES AND MEXICO.—There are au-
6 thorized to be appropriated for fiscal year 2011, for
7 “International Boundary and Water Commission, United
8 States and Mexico”—

9 (1) \$47,431,000 for “Salaries and Expenses”;

10 and

11 (2) \$26,900,000 for “Construction”.

12 (c) INTERNATIONAL BOUNDARY COMMISSION,
13 UNITED STATES AND CANADA.—There is authorized to
14 be appropriated \$2,422,000 for fiscal year 2011 for
15 “International Boundary Commission, United States and
16 Canada”.

17 (d) INTERNATIONAL JOINT COMMISSION.—There is
18 authorized to be appropriated \$7,631,000 for fiscal year
19 2011 for “International Joint Commission”.

20 (e) INTERNATIONAL FISHERIES COMMISSIONS.—

21 (1) IN GENERAL.—There is authorized to be
22 appropriated \$43,600,000 for fiscal year 2011 for
23 “International Fisheries Commissions”.

24 (2) PACIFIC SALMON TREATY.—Of the amounts
25 authorized to be appropriated for fiscal year 2011

1 for “International Fisheries Commissions”, up to
2 \$15,000,000 may be used in each fiscal year to
3 make such payments to Canada as may be necessary
4 to fulfill United States obligations under the Pacific
5 Salmon Treaty.

6 **SEC. 604. MIGRATION AND REFUGEE ASSISTANCE.**

7 (a) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is
8 authorized to be appropriated for fiscal year 2011, for au-
9 thorized activities for “Migration and Refugee Assist-
10 ance”, \$1,605,400,000—

11 (1) of which \$25,000,000 may be used for the
12 resettlement of humanitarian migrants to Israel; and

13 (2) which shall remain available until expended.

14 (b) EMERGENCY REFUGEE AND MIGRATION ASSIST-
15 ANCE ACCOUNT.—Section 2(c)(2) of the Migration and
16 Refugee Assistance Act of 1962 (22 U.S.C. 2601(c)(2))
17 is amended by striking “\$100,000,000” and inserting
18 “\$200,000,000.”.

19 **SEC. 605. CENTERS AND FOUNDATIONS.**

20 (a) ASIA FOUNDATION.—There is authorized to be
21 appropriated \$15,690,000 for fiscal year 2011 to carry
22 out authorized activities for “The Asia Foundation”.

23 (b) NATIONAL ENDOWMENT FOR DEMOCRACY.—
24 There is authorized to be appropriated \$105,000,000 for

1 fiscal year 2011 to carry out authorized activities for “Na-
2 tional Endowment for Democracy”.

3 (c) CENTER FOR CULTURAL AND TECHNICAL INTER-
4 CHANGE BETWEEN EAST AND WEST.—There is author-
5 ized to be appropriated \$11,400,000 for fiscal year 2011
6 to carry out authorized activities for “Center for Cultural
7 and Technical Interchange Between East and West”.

8 **Subtitle B—United States Inter-**
9 **national Broadcasting Activities**

10 **SEC. 611. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

11 There are authorized to be appropriated to carry out
12 United States Government international broadcasting ac-
13 tivities under the United States Information and Edu-
14 cational Exchange Act of 1948, the Radio Broadcasting
15 to Cuba Act, the Television Broadcasting to Cuba Act, the
16 United States International Broadcasting Act of 1994,
17 and the Foreign Affairs Reform and Restructuring Act of
18 1998, and to carry out other authorities in law related
19 to such purposes—

20 (1) \$755,143,000 for fiscal year 2011 for
21 “International Broadcasting Operations”; and

22 (2) \$13,635,000 for the fiscal year 2011 for
23 “Broadcasting Capital Improvements”.

1 **Subtitle C—Peace Corps**

2 **SEC. 621. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

3 Section 3(b)(1) of the Peace Corps Act (22 U.S.C.
4 2502(b)(1)) is amended to read as follows:

5 “(1) There is authorized to be appropriated
6 \$446,150,000 for fiscal year 2011 to carry out the
7 purposes of this chapter.”.
