2 SEC. 6. REPORT ON IMPACTS ON THE ISLAMIC REPUBLIC 3 OF IRAN OF SANCTIONS IMPOSED BY THE

UNITED STATES.

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after the 6 date of the enactment this Act, the Secretary of State, 7 in consultation with the Secretary of the Treasury and 8 drawing on subject-matter experts including economists 9 and statisticians from the Department of State and the 10 Department of the Treasury, shall submit to the appro2

priate congressional committees a report on the impacts
 on the Islamic Republic of Iran of sanctions imposed by
 the United States.

4 (b) ELEMENTS.—The report required by subsection5 (a) shall include an assessment of the following:

6 (1) The impact of sanctions imposed by the7 United States on the following:

8 (A) Problematic activities and policies of 9 the Islamic Republic of Iran, including ballistic 10 missile development, proliferation of Iranian 11 drones and missiles to state and non-state ac-12 tors, uranium enrichment, and funding of ter-13 rorist groups in the "Axis of Resistance", and 14 how sanctions have meaningfully impacted the 15 ability of such groups to operate.

16 (B) Key officials of the Iranian regime, in17 cluding their access to alternative financial
18 markets, their standard of living, and impacts
19 to their personal wealth.

20 (C) The operations of independent civil so21 ciety organizations in Iran, including the ability
22 of such organizations to access products that
23 would allow them to document and share
24 human rights abuses, promote democratic
25 norms, and engage in political dissent.

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(D) The efficacy of licensing actions aimed
at ensuring the people of Iran have access to
circumvention technologies around Iranian re-
gime firewalls and censors to promote internet
freedom, including General License D-2 of the
Department of the Treasury.
(E) The standard of living of the people of
Iran, including—
(i) the impact on the purchasing
power of the people of Iran and their abil-
ity to afford and acquire food and medi-
cine; and
(ii) changes in the size of the working
and middle classes in Iran, including im-
pacts to the poverty rate in Iran.
(F) The growth of unofficial economies
controlled by officials of the Iranian regime and
members of the Islamic Revolutionary Guard
Corps.
