1	(3) urges the Government of Afghanistan to
2	conduct the elections in full accordance with the
3	Constitution of Afghanistan, to include maintaining
4	the constitutionally-mandated allocation of seats for
5	women's parliamentary participation;
6	(4) honors the sacrifice of United States, coali-
7	tion, and Afghan service members who have been
8	killed or injured since October 2001 in defense of
9	the democratic rights of the Afghan people;
10	(5) recognizes the substantial investment made
11	by the United States taxpayers in support of sta-
12	bility, democracy, and the rule of law in Afghani-
13	stan, including efforts to end public corruption;
14	(6) recognizes the commitment of the Govern-
15	ment of Afghanistan to hold presidential elections in
16	2014 and the current president's commitment not to
17	seek a third term;
18	(7) recognizes that transparent and credible
19	elections will help safeguard the legitimacy of the
20	next Afghan government and will help prevent fu-
21	ture violence by groups that may be ready to contest
22	a process perceived as rigged or dishonest;
23	(8) recognizes that a democratically-elected and
24	legitimate government is important to ensuring the
25	long term stability of Afghanistan, as is the success-

3	(9) urges the Government of Afghanistan to re-
4	spect and support the independence and impartiality
5	of the Independent Electoral Commission (IEC) and
6	the need for an independent and impartial elections
7	complaints mechanism with clear jurisdiction over
8	the final results, and urges all parties not to inter-
9	fere with their deliberations;
10	(10) urges the Parliament of Afghanistan to
11	pass legislation that will establish a consultative and

11	to ensure that all United States Government efforts
12	in Afghanistan are well-coordinated and are fully
13	consistent with the American taxpayers longstanding
14	commitment to stability, democracy, and the rule of
15	law in Afghanistan, including efforts to end public
16	corruption; and
17	(17) urges the Secretary of State to condition
18	financial, logistical, and political support for Λf -
19	ghanistan's 2014 elections based on the implementa-
20	tion of reforms in Afghanistan including—
21	(A) increased efforts to encourage women's
22	participation in the electoral process, including
23	provisions to ensure their full access to and se-
24	curity at polling stations;

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1	(B) the implementation of measures to
2	prevent fraudulent registration and manipula-
3	tion of the voting or counting processes, includ-
4	ing—
5	(i) establishment of processes to bet-
6	ter control ballots;
7	(ii) vetting of and training for election
8	officials; and
9	(iii) full accreditation of and access
10	for international and domestic election ob-
11	servers; and
12	(C) prompt passage of legislation through
13	the Parliament of Afghanistan that codifies the
14	authorities and independence of the IEC and an
15	independent and impartial election complaints
16	mechanism.
