AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE intended  
to be proposed by Mr. YOUNG

Viz:

1 Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the fol-  
2 lowing:

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Ukraine Human  
5 Rights Policy Act of 2022”.

6 **SEC. 2. CONGRESSIONAL OVERSIGHT OF MANDATORY IM-  
7 POSITION OF SANCTIONS WITH RESPECT TO  
8 TRANSACTIONS WITH PERSONS RESPON-  
9 SIBLE FOR HUMAN RIGHTS ABUSES.**

10 Section 11 of the Support for the Sovereignty, Integ-  
11 rity, Democracy, and Economic Stability of Ukraine Act  
12 of 2014 (22 U.S.C. 8910) is amended—

1           (1) by redesignating subsections (d) and (e) as  
2 subsections (e) and (f), respectively; and

3           (2) by inserting after subsection (c) the fol-  
4 lowing:

5           “(d) CONGRESSIONAL OVERSIGHT.—

6           “(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 60 days  
7 after receiving a request from the chairman and  
8 ranking member of one of the appropriate congress-  
9 sional committees with respect to whether a person  
10 meets the criteria of a person described in sub-  
11 section (a), the President shall—

12           “(A) determine if the person meets such  
13 criteria; and

14           “(B) submit a classified or unclassified re-  
15 port to such chairman and ranking member  
16 with respect to such determination that includes  
17 a statement of whether or not the President im-  
18 posed or intends to impose sanctions under sub-  
19 section (b) with respect to such person.

20           “(2) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMIT-  
21 TEES DEFINED.—In this subsection, the term ‘ap-  
22 propriate congressional committees’ means—

23           “(A) the Committee on Foreign Affairs of  
24 the House of Representatives; and

1                   “(B) the Committee on Foreign Relations  
2                   of the Senate.”.

3 **SEC. 3. SENSE OF CONGRESS.**

4           Section 252 of the Countering America’s Adversaries  
5 Through Sanctions Act (22 U.S.C. 9542) is amended—

6                   (1) by striking paragraph (1) and inserting the  
7                   following:

8                   “(1) the Government of the Russian Federation  
9                   bears responsibility for the continuing violence in  
10                  Ukraine and imposition onto Ukrainian sov-  
11                  ereignty;”;

12                  (2) by redesignating paragraphs (2) through  
13                  (10) as paragraphs (5) through (13), respectively;

14                  (3) by inserting after paragraph (1) the fol-  
15                  lowing:

16                  “(2) the Government of the Russian Federa-  
17                  tion’s invasion of Ukraine reflects years of disregard  
18                  for territorial integrity across the European con-  
19                  tinent;

20                  “(3) paramilitary organizations are utilized by  
21                  the Government of the Russian Federation to exe-  
22                  cute foreign policy goals, including through influence  
23                  campaigns, economic coercion, and violence;

24                  “(4) ongoing violence from the Government of  
25                  the Russian Federation across Europe creates impli-

1 cations for allies and partners of the United States  
2 outside of the European continent, and a deterrence  
3 strategy therefore requires coordination and coopera-  
4 tion with like-minded partners across the globe;”;  
5 and

6 (4) by amending subparagraph (A) of para-  
7 graph (12) (as redesignated) to read as follows:

8 “(A) to identify vulnerabilities to aggres-  
9 sion, information operations, in particular cyber  
10 warfare and military information support oper-  
11 ations, corruption, and hybrid warfare by the  
12 Government of the Russian Federation and its  
13 proxy forces;”.

14 **SEC. 4. REPORT ON HUMAN RIGHTS ABUSES BY THE RUS-**  
15 **SIAN FEDERATION IN UKRAINE AND AGAINST**  
16 **UKRAINIAN RESIDENTS FORCIBLY RELO-**  
17 **CATED.**

18 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of State should in-  
19 clude in the report required by sections 116(d) and 502B  
20 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C.  
21 2151n(d) and 2304) information on human rights abuses  
22 committed by Russian forces or persons acting on behalf  
23 of the Russian Federation in Ukraine or against individ-  
24 uals who reside in Ukraine who are forcibly relocated.

1 (b) MATTERS TO BE INCLUDED.—The information  
2 required under subsection (a) shall include—

3 (1) an assessment of Russian forces and Rus-  
4 sian Federation-affiliated non-state groups involved  
5 in human rights abuses against civilians in Ukraine;

6 (2) an assessment of the number of individuals  
7 detained in filtration camps operated by the Russian  
8 Federation or its proxies;

9 (3) a description of the conditions in such  
10 camps for detainees, including, to the extent prac-  
11 ticable, an assessment of—

12 (A) methods of abuse;

13 (B) efforts to force individuals to renounce  
14 their faith; and

15 (C) other serious human rights abuses;

16 (4) to the extent practicable, an assessment of  
17 staffing levels at such camps, including such camps  
18 at which military, governmental, or other units are  
19 in charge;

20 (5) a description, as appropriate, of United  
21 States diplomatic efforts with allies and other coun-  
22 tries and relevant international organizations—

23 (A) to address the gross violations of  
24 human rights against Ukrainians; and

1 (B) to prosecute individuals responsible for  
2 committing human rights violations; and

3 (6) the identification of the offices within the  
4 Department of State that are responsible for leading  
5 and coordinating the diplomatic efforts referred to in  
6 paragraph (5).

7 (c) COLLECTION OF INFORMATION.—The Secretary  
8 shall collect the information required under subsection (a)  
9 in consultation with the heads of other relevant Federal  
10 departments and agencies and civil society organizations.

11 **SEC. 5. CLASSIFIED ASSESSMENT OF ABILITY OF UNITED**  
12 **STATES TO COLLECT INTELLIGENCE RELAT-**  
13 **ING TO WAR CRIMES AND HUMAN RIGHTS**  
14 **ABUSES.**

15 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of State and the  
16 Director of National Intelligence, in consultation with  
17 such elements of the intelligence community (as defined  
18 in section 3 of the National Security Act of 1947 (50  
19 U.S.C. 3003)) as the Director deems appropriate, shall  
20 submit to the committees specified in subsection (b) a  
21 classified report that assesses the ability of the United  
22 States Government to collect and analyze intelligence re-  
23 garding—

24 (1) the scope and scale of war crimes and geno-  
25 cide committed against individuals who reside in

1 Ukraine by the Russian Armed Forces or Russian  
2 Federation-affiliated non-state groups;

3 (2) the scope and scale of the detention and  
4 forced labor of Ukrainian nationals in Ukraine and  
5 the Russian Federation;

6 (3) the gross abuses of human rights per-  
7 petrated inside the filtration camps and other deten-  
8 tion centers operated by the Russian Federation or  
9 Russian Federation-affiliated non-state groups; and

10 (4) other actions of the Government of the Rus-  
11 sian Federation that constitute gross violations of  
12 human rights related to the invasion of Ukraine by  
13 the Russian Federation.

14 (b) COMMITTEES SPECIFIED.—The committees spec-  
15 ified in this subsection are—

16 (1) the Committee on Foreign Relations and  
17 the Select Committee on Intelligence of the Senate;  
18 and

19 (2) the Committee on Foreign Affairs and the  
20 Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence of the  
21 House of Representatives.
