6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 60 days after the

7 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall sub-

8 mit an unclassified report to the appropriate congressional

9 committees that describes the implementation by the Gov-

10 ernment of Bahrain of the recommendations contained in

11 the 2011 Report of the Bahrain Independent Commission

1 of Inquiry (referred to in this section as the “Bahrain Re-  
2 port”).

3 (b) CONTENT.—The report required under subsection  
4 (a) shall include—

5 (1) a description of the specific steps taken by  
6 the Government of Bahrain to implement each of the  
7 26 recommendations contained in the Bahrain Re-  
8 port;

9 (2) an assessment of whether the Government  
10 of Bahrain has “fully complied with”, “partially im-  
11 plemented”, or “not meaningfully implemented”  
12 each recommendation referred to in paragraph (1);

13 (3) for each recommendation referred to in  
14 paragraph (1) that was “partially implemented” or  
15 “not meaningfully implemented” by the Government  
16 of Bahrain, specific recommendations of short- and  
17 long-term steps the Government of Bahrain should  
18 take to fully implement each recommendation; and

19 (4) an assessment of the impact of the findings  
20 in the Bahrain Report for the United States security  
21 posture in the Arab Gulf and the area of responsi-  
22 bility of the United States Central Command.
