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1 OPENING STATEMENT OF HON. JOHN F. KERRY, U.S. SENATOR 2 FROM MASSACHUSETTS

The Chairman: The meeting will come to order. We have six Senators here which is the requisite number to be talking about amendments. So I'm going to proceed forward so that hopefully everybody's here and we can have a rapid vote.

8 We have four legislative items, including S.3317, the 9 Haiti Empowerment, Assistance, and Rebuilding Act of 2010, 10 three nominations, and a Foreign Service List.

On the Haiti bill, I'm pleased to join with Senator Corker and Senator Cardin, Senator Durbin in co-sponsoring the bill. This is a bill that we think sets an important marker, if you will, with respect to the congressional commitment of rebuilding Haiti.

There's been a lot of talk about it. This is the time really to put the rubber on the road, so to speak. It establishes a policy framework that emphasizes democratic and competent governance, seeks to improve security and promote the economic growth and it tasks USAID with developing a comprehensive rebuilding strategy.

I want to thank everybody, the staff on both sides, and members of both sides for pulling this together. I think we have a stronger bill as a result of the constructive input from my colleagues on both sides of the

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1 aisle.

2	There are two proposed amendments to the Haiti bill.							
3	One is the Manager $\underline{\ }'s \underline{\ }'$ Amendment which is just several minor							
4	fixes. They don't substantively affect any purpose or							
5	scope of the bill. The second is an amendment from Senator							
6	Lugar which reduces the authorization of the bill by three							
7	years and 1.5 billion and I support Senator Lugar's							
8	amendment and urge all of our colleagues to do so, as well.							
9	The original legislation was written to try to							
10	demonstrate our long-term commitment to Haiti by							
11	authorizing for five years, but I recognize, and I think							
12	Senator Lugar appropriately addresses a concern, that we							
13	don't really know what's going to develop over the next							
14	five years, and I think that's a fair comment. It may							
15	change significantly in the next two years. So this gives							
16	us an opportunity to re-examine the funding after that							
17	period of time and to respond accordingly.							
18	So we need to vote on the Manager $_s'$ Amendment,							
19	<mark>sS</mark> enator Lugar's amendment. I'm not aware of any requests							
20	for a roll call vote. I believe we are permitted with six							
21	with this current number what do we have? One, two,							
22	three, four we have we have a quorum. So we can							
23	proceed forward on all.							

24 So we can have a voice vote on the Manager's 25 Amendment. Is there any debate on it at all?

1 [No response.] 2 The Chairman: If not, why, all those in favor say 3 aye. 4 [Chorus of ayes.] 5 The Chairman: Opposed, nay. 6 [No response.] 7 The Chairman: The ayes have it. The Manager's 8 Amendment passes. 9 On the Lugar amendment likewise, all those in favor 10 say aye. 11 [Chorus of ayes.] 12 The Chairman: Opposed, nay. 13 [No response.] The Chairman: The ayes have it and it is amended. We 14 15 need to vote on the final bill as amended. Is there any 16 comment or debate? 17 [No response.] The Chairman: If not, all those in favor of the Haiti 18 19 Act vote say aye. 20 [Chorus of ayes.] 21 The Chairman: Opposed, nay. [No response.] 22 23 The Chairman: The ayes have it, and it is approved, 24 and I appreciate everybody's help on that. 25 We have three other quick legislative items. Senate

S.3104 amends the International Broadcasting Act of 1944
which created Radio Free Asia to provide RFA with a
permanent authorization. Senator Lugar introduced this
bill. Senators Kaufman, Webb, and Riche are among the co sponsors, and I understand, Senator Kaufman, you wanted to
say something about it.

7 Senator Kaufman: Yes. If you were on the Internet 8 during the riots in Tibet, the Number 1 thing Googled was 9 Radio Free Asia. More people followed it than any other 10 news service and when it got to the riots, it was the same 11 thing. They really exposed to the whole world what was 12 going on there before anyone else did and so it's -- it 13 deserves to be treated just like our other broadcasters and 14 not be up for sunset every so often.

Senator Lugar: Mr. Chairman, I'd like to commend Senator Kaufman on his really extraordinary leadership in this whole area of communication and I appreciate very much working with him.

19 The Chairman: Well, thank you, Senator Lugar. I join 20 in commending our colleague. I think he's the Senate's 21 expert on all of our public communication programs and we 22 really appreciate and respect your commitment to that for a 23 long time.

The two resolutions on the agenda, one recognizes the 60th Anniversary of the Fulbright Program in Thailand.

Senator Lugar introduced this resolution. I'm pleased to
join him as a co-sponsor. A resolution, in addition to
that, that I introduced in recognition of the 2010 Shanghai
Exposition.

5 Finally, there are three nominations on the Foreign 6 Service List on the agenda, the nominations of Michael 7 Meehan and Dana Perino to the Broadcasting Board of 8 Governors and Michael Warren to the Overseas Board of 9 Governors. Two of those have been previously held over at 10 Senator DeMint's request. I think all three are qualified 11 nominees. I'd like to move them so.

12 If there are no requests for a roll call vote, I would 13 like to vote en bloc on all of those remaining items on the 14 agenda that I just listed. Is there any objection to doing 15 so?

16 [No response.]

17 The Chairman: If not, and no further debate, all18 those in favor say aye.

19 [Chorus of ayes.]

20 The Chairman: Opposed, nay.

21 [No response.]

The Chairman: The ayes have it, and the business of the committee is completed.

I thank everybody for providing a quick quorum. We stand adjourned.
